I. Call to Order

Chairman Hansen called the TCC meeting to order at 10:47 am.

II. Welcome and Introductions

Mr. Hansen welcomed members to the TCC meeting and acknowledged all who were in person and those who were virtual.

III. Public Comment

No one signed up for public comment and no requests were received.

Action Items

IV. Draft 2024-2033 MTIP Amendment 7

Ms. Kutz asked for a recommendation to amend the 2024-2033 MTIP. Amendment 7 covers the modifications in NCDOT's Item N report for the months of October. The amendment modifies funding for Jacksonville urban area projects HS-2003AF, HS-2003AG, HS-2003AM. These projects are being delayed in construction from FY24 to FY25. Projects AV-5806 and U-5789 have delayed construction from FY25 to FY26. Additional Item-N reports are anticipated to be released by the STIP office in November and December.

Mr. Hansen asked if there were any questions on the action item and none were received. Mr. Hansen asked for a motion to recommend Amendment 7 adoption to the TAC. Mr. Whitehead made a motion; Mr. King seconded the motion. The motion was approved by the committee members present both in person and virtual.

V. Town Of Swansboro Traffic Impact Analysis (TIA)

Mr. Prinz asked for recommendation of support to the TAC for a TIA study in the Swansboro area. Mr. Prinz explained that JUMPO, JOED, and the Town of Swansboro will be working together in scoping a traffic impact analysis (TIA) at the area of Belgrade-Swansboro Rd and NC-24. The study will explore impacts to the roadways of a planned business/industrial development which will be a critical element in driving economic development for the township and surrounding area. This is in the early stages and the cost for the study is currently unknown. A preliminary map of the area was shown as to the expected location. There was brief discussion from members on known developments along Belgrade-Swansboro Rd, and also the future improvements projects for NC-24.

Mr. Hansen asked for a motion to recommend support for the Swansboro TIA to the TAC. Mr. Whitehead made a motion; Mr. Massey seconded the motion. The motion was approved by the committee members present both in person and virtual.

Reports/Comments

VI. Report from MPO Secretary

Due the meeting being virtual and only covering two items, there were a few brief status updates on projects. Ms. Kutz reported that the Paved Trails study is expected to be completed in early December. Mr. Prinz reported that the Western/Henderson Intersection is going well, and construction is nearing completion with the installation of the center median. Project U-5728 (US-17 BUS/Bell Fork Rd intersection improvement) is currently undergoing ROW finalization. Additional time is required as to waiting for deed restrictions for the Navy owned parcel being turned over officially to the City. This delay is estimated until May 2025.

VII. Report from NCDOT Division 3

Due the meeting being virtual and only covering two items, no updates from Division 3 were reported.

VIII. Report from NCDOT Transportation Planning Division

Due the meeting being virtual and only covering two items, no updates from TPD were reported.

IX. Report from FHWA Field Officer

Due the meeting being virtual and only covering two items, no updates from FHWA were reported.

X. Questions, Closing Comments

Chairman Hansen asked if there were any additional questions or comments not covered in the meeting and none were received. Mr. Hansen thanked everyone for attending in person, and virtually, and asked for an adjournment of the TCC meeting. Mr. King made a motion to adjourn; Mr. Whitehead seconded the motion.
